Community College Survey of Student Engagement – Significant Findings

The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) helps UTTC collect information about student engagement, which is a key indicator of college quality. The data also provides information about how UTTC compares with other institutions who participated in the survey. UTTC did **statistically better** than the other institutions in some areas, including:

UTTC provides students with more support they need to thrive socially and cope with non-academic responsibilities than other institutions.



Students at UTTC interact with faculty to discuss grades or assignments and to work on activities other than coursework more often than at other colleges.



Students at UTTC are much more likely to participate in college-sponsored activities and student clubs and are less likely to have jobs while in college than other colleges, including other TCUs.



Students at UTTC place higher importance on student organizations, childcare, computer labs, and job placement services than students at other colleges.

Students at UTTC are also much more likely to use these services.
